Structure, governance and management

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. All members of the congregation are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and stand for election to the PCC.

Objectives and activities

Rennington with Rock PCC has the responsibility of co-operating with the incumbent, or priest in charge, in promoting in the Benefice of Embleton and Rennington with Rock the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, social and ecumenical, and to maintain the church building and its contents in good repair.

Achievements and performance Church attendance

There are 10 parishioners on the Church Electoral Roll, three of whom live outside the parish. The average attendance at the 11.15 Holy Communion service on the second Sunday of the month was 11; the average attendance at the 10.00 Morning Prayer service on the fourth Sunday of the month was 10. Because of the interregnum communion services have been taken by a number of retired clergy: Canon Bob Burston, Revd John Wylam, Revd Christopher Smith, Revd Pat Gillham, Revd Sue Allen and Revd John Holland. The Morning Prayer services are taken by Bill Devonshire. We are very grateful to all of them.

A Benefice service was held on 30 April taken by Bishop Christine, which 61 people attended. Another Benefice service was held on 4 June, taken by Canon Bob Burston, with the Embassy Singers from Berlin enhancing the music. They had given a much-appreciated concert in the church on the previous evening, on the theme of 'Peace on Earth'.

On 2 April the Baptism of Beatrice Mary Bosanquet took place, taken by Canon Bob Burston.

Coffee and biscuits or cake are served after the Morning Prayer service on the fourth Sunday of the month. We are most grateful to Bill Devonshire and those who provide cake.

Review of the year

The full PCC of Rennington and Rock met 5 times with an average of 6 members in attendance.

We do not have any sub-committees.

We would very much welcome new members of the Electoral Roll and the PCC.

We are grateful to all those who have helped with flower arranging and cleaning, and to the staff of Rock Estate and Rock Farms Ltd for cutting the grass in the churchyard and providing the bonfire and fireworks.

Fundraising events were the Rose Supper kindly hosted by Bill Devonshire, the Embassy Choir concert, and the Bonfire party, which together raised a total of £1662.

On Sunday 22 October a special service was held to mark Bill Devonshire's 25 years as a Reader, followed by a party at Lady Well House.

Organ

We are most grateful to our voluntary organists, David Head and Peter Hignett, for playing for us regularly. David plays on second Sundays and Peter on fourth Sundays. They cope magnificently with the problems caused by cold winter temperatures, such as sticking keys.

Finance

For full details please see the Treasurer's Report. Expenditure exceeded receipts by £574, largely owing to the fact that our parish share increased by 15 per cent. We have been fortunate that we did not have any major repair bills, and the grass cutting was once again done free by the Rock Estate. Shared parish expenses were lower than usual because of the interregnum, and will rise in 2018.

Reserves policy

A policy will be stated when needed with an increased level of funding.
